Welcome to the 'new normal'! We are excited to relaunch a number of services that were put on hold last year. This means we are now running support groups throughout Queensland, and can provide more one-on-one services in person.

Our team is looking forward to once again meeting with clients face-to-face. We will also continue our online and phone services, to ensure that you can chat with our team when you need it, regardless of where you are.

We have developed Covid-safe procedures and protocols to keep our clients and team safe, so you may notice additional steps or requirements when you see us. This includes:

- recording details of support group attendees to assist with contact tracing
- · sanitising meeting spaces before and after use
- providing face masks and hand sanitiser when meeting in person or travelling in cars with our team

This significant achievement was in recognition of Ann's long history of service to people living with Huntington's disease, including carers. Congratulations to Ann on this wonderful recognition!

The founder of Huntington's Disease Youth Organisation (HDYO), **Matt Ellison**, has received one of the highest honours available to people in the UK. Matt was awarded an MBE, which he accepted from the Queen at Buckingham palace earlier this year.

The MBE was given to Matt in recognition of his dedication to young people impacted by HD, and the development and management of HDYO. HDYO have contacted and assisted young people in 90 countries, and Huntingtons Queensland is proud to support their work. Congratulations Matt! We also ask that you do not attend any in-person service if you or a member of your household:

- is displaying any symptoms of Covid-19 (cough, sneezing, sore throat, runny nose, headache, fever, shortness of breath, other signs of illness)

## Dancing at the Vatican

The documentary *Dancing at the Vatican* premiered online in Australia in June, inviting viewers from all over the country to watch the film from the comfort of their own home.

Dancing at the Vatican documents the journey of Huntington's disease-impacted families from all around the world, including from some of the poorest areas of South America, as they travelled to the Vatican for an assembly with the Pope.

The project, named HDden no more, was spearheaded by renowned war reporter Charles Sabine, who is also a global HD advocate, and is gene positive. Sabine was instrumental in organising the meeting with the Pope, which became the first time a world leader publically acknowledged the presence of Huntington's disease.

Charles Sabine joined a number of leading Australian doctors and researchers for a special Q&A following the documentary screening.

#### Moratorium on genetic testing for life insurance

In 2019, changes were introduced for new life insurance applicants. Between 1 July 2019 and 30 June 2024, life insurers will not use genetic test results as part of the assessment process for people applying for death and Total & Permanent Injury (TPI) polices up to a certain amount.

#### Have your say on housing

Are you impacted by Huntington's disease, and have had difficulty finding suitable housing and support?

Researchers from the Summer Foundation and La Trobe University are conducting a study investigating housing, services and supports for people living with Huntington's disease, including carers. The study is hoping to include people impacted by HD who have had good or poor housing experiences. It will comprise an hour-long one-on-one interview with a researcher, either via zoom or on telephone. Participants will receive a \$60 gift card.
